The need for culturally competent, bilingual counselors has never been greater, and Seminary of the Southwest has developed a fellowship program to prepare and deploy counselors to work with underserved populations in the Richmond, Texas area.



What does it mean to be a Richmond Area Bilingual Fellow?

Richmond Area Bilingual Fellows will:

- Have tuition covered at up to 80%
- Be eligible for subsidized on campus housing if available
- Have placement in a bilingual/bicultural setting for degree program practicum
- Receive reimbursement for graduation MHC exam fees
- Have a paid LPC-Associate internship site waiting for them upon graduation

Why the Richmond Area Bilingual Fellows Program?

Approximately 60% of Richmond area residents are Latinx, with 1 in 4 households living below the poverty level. The shortage of Spanish-speaking mental health providers is a well-documented barrier to access to counseling services. Our goal is to establish a pipeline of Spanish-speaking mental health counselors to serve the diverse individuals and families of the greater Richmond, TX area. To do so will require trainees not only equipped to provide culturally and spiritually-responsive care, but also Spanish-speaking services to Latinx individuals and families.

How does the Richmond Area Bilingual Fellows program work?

Upon entering the **Master of Clinical Mental Health Counseling (MHC)** program, students are eligible for:

- Generous tuition assistance
- Priority listed for student housing with approx. \$5,880 annually towards rent
- Up to \$2,000 annually in campus work study opportunities

During final three semesters, students will be enrolled in clinical practicum courses and will see Spanish-speaking clients. Students will receive specialized training and supervision at the seminary's designated practicum site.

After final confirmation into the Richmond Area Bilingual Fellows program: • Reimbursement for counseling exam fees

Reimbursement for State of Texas LPC-Associate application/licensing fees

Receive **\$5,000** moving allowance to move to to Richmond and begin employment at **The Houston Galveston Institute (HGI).**

Begin two-year commitment as a Richmond Area Bilingual Fellow LPC-Associate at HGI: • Receive annual salary of **\$56,000 for two years** (approx. \$48,000 in salary and

- \$8,000 in benefits such as health insurance, retirement, etc.)
- Annual counselor liability insurance costs covered for two years
- Annual supervision by HGI bilingual counseling supervisor and MHC faculty

At the end of the two-year fellowship and the completion of the state-mandated 3,000 LPC-Associate hours, apply for full licensure to be a **Licensed Professional Counselor**.

Eligibility

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To be eligible for the fellowship, students must be bilingual Spanish/English speakers who commit to work in a paid internship in the Richmond, TX area for two years following graduation.

Fellows who meet the MHC degree program and fellowship requirements will have guaranteed placement with The Houston Galveston Institute (HGI), (hgicounseling.org) for their two-year paid post-graduate internship. A stipend for moving costs to the Richmond area will be provided. During these two years, fellows will receive a salary and full benefits paid as well as all supervisory fees covered. This will allow fellows to complete the 3,000 supervised hours required for LPC licensing by the state of Texas.

Fellows must enroll as full-time students in the Clinical Mental Health Counseling program at Southwest (ssw.edu/MHC) and maintain full-time status for the entirety of the three-year MHC degree program. Richmond Area Fellows entering the program in fall 2022 will begin the fellowship at HGI in the summer of 2025.
